

Dear Friends,

I'm just back from Tucson with very raw emotions. The people killed and wounded and their families are in deep grieving mode, trying to move forward while being watched by the world. I was able to be at Services of our two Tucson congregations and I know people there are exhibiting all the emotions you all have felt, but they have pulled together in their UU communities supporting each other as we move through this horrific time.

As I drove home from Tucson my mind wandered to my wonderful daughter who continues to be a dedicated Unitarian Universalist, often out on the street corner in demonstrations in her

community. She is teaching her young children the value of caring for others and speaking up for your beliefs -- they have joined her on those street corners. Yet I have to admit what hit me most was fear, not for myself but for my daughter and grandchildren.


This is a time when we know how important our Unitarian Universalists communities are for each of us. We cannot and should not deal with our feelings about what happened in Tucson alone.
