Inheritor of a proud tradition, UUWF was formed in 1963 through consolidation of the Association of Universalist Women (founded in 1869 and believed to be the first organization of lay church women in the United States) and the Alliance of Unitarian Women (1890). Women's Fed is a circle of liberal religious women and men working to advance justice for women and girls and promote their spiritual growth.

It's UUWF's policy to keep group members on the membership rolls for a year after they cease paying dues. So current members can continue to receive the UUWF newsletter through 2012 and current or new members can still join as individuals - there's information about that at www.uuwf.org.
