Minister's Message

Good Tidings

In Luke's Christmas story, the angels bring the shepherds' "good tidings of comfort and joy" announcing the birth of Jesus. The phrase "good tidings" is an interesting translation. Tidings are, by definition, "good news," derived from the Norse usage indicating that a good fortune comes with the rising tides in that sea-faring culture. Good tidings then are doubly good news: something miraculous has been born out of the ordinary. Considering that the shepherds were all alone in the countryside on a cold night, a brilliant star suddenly filling the sky would indeed be out of the ordinary and likely frightening.

As these days shorten towards our solstice, we, even as moderns, look for good tidings. Christmas is such a complex time of year, full of joy and woe, celebrations and disappointments. We all need some news to tide us over to the other side of night. I see those tidings close to home: In the holiday baskets the children in our Church are assembling for our shut-ins. In the hospitality we enjoy after Services. In the countless small exchanges we make with one another, be it a card or a hug. If we look at the small miracles of our lives, there are tidings to carry us through.

Make it a point this holiday season to spread just a little bit of cheer to someone you might not normally give a second thought to, and know their world is made a bit brighter.
