

From Rev. Tamara's Desk

While raising my children, now ages 20 and 24, I often felt that I was trying to undo the messages they were receiving in the broader culture. Indeed, for myself as an adult, I seek out like-minded people in our UU community

which supports our individual and collective growth toward progressive, compassionate, and constructive values. In striving for these goals, UU minister Tom Owen-Towle calls us "free-thinking mystics with hands."

How can we best develop this three aspect nature? Author Dale McGowan (*Parenting Beyond Belief, Raising Freethinkers*) has collaborated with several others to set forth a list of guidelines for parents navigating these sometime difficult waters, which hold up equally well as goals for people of all ages:

- 1. Encourage ever-wider circles of empathy
- 2. Nurture active moral development
- 3. Promote ravenous curiosity
- 4. Teach engaged coexistence
- 5. Encourage religious literacy
- 6. Leave people unlabeled
- 7. Make death natural and familiar
- 8. Invite the questioning of authority
