Minister's Message

Stand For Justice

I was appalled by the "not guilty" verdict for the shooting death of Trayvon Martin by George Zimmerman. The failure to convict a vigilante proves that our work to undo systemic racism in this country is far from over. George Zimmerman was able to avoid justice by claiming self defense as he shot Martin, an unarmed 17 year old African American boy. Zimmerman's defense focused largely on Florida's "Stand Your Ground" law which allows for lethal self defense should one feel



threatened inside or outside your home. I was outraged at the initial failure of the police to investigate Martin's death, outraged at their job of collecting evidence, outraged over a system of jury selection that allows so many peremptory challenges, outraged that we have armed civilians and call it legal.

As Taquiena Boston, the director of Multicultural Growth & Witness at the Unitarian Universalist Association put it:

Trayvon Martin was a youth. George Zimmerman was an adult male. Trayvon Martin was on foot. George Zimmerman was following Trayvon in a vehicle. Trayvon Martin was unarmed. George Zimmerman had a gun.

If Zimmerman thought Trayvon Martin posed a potential threat, why didn't he remain in his vehicle and follow law enforcement's instructions?

of a society that criminalizes dark skin, criminalizes poverty, and criminalizes youth. This criminalization of youth and young adult males of color is a mindset that has been linked to institutional racism and white supremacy—a mindset that frames youth of color as criminal and dangerous. How do we transcend this negative frame and see the humanity of our young people?

As "technically correct" as this verdict may have been from a legal standpoint, it is morally reprehensible from our religious standpoint. When institutions such as the courts support racism we, as religious liberals, have a responsibility to take a stand. I plan to lend my support to the "Movement to End the New Jim Crow."

Let us work for love and justice by building this movement. I will be leading a discussion on the book by this name this fall and inviting us to get more involved in <u>racial justice making</u>.
