### Minister's Message

### Love Beyond Belief!

You may have noticed that in some of our literature we have been adding a tag line for our church: "Love Beyond Belief!" That simple statement comes from the work of the UU Theologian Thandeka, who believes that we can grow in ministry and spiritual depth by moving beyond our post-enlightenment boxes of what we each individually believe and embrace the faith-giving love that is at the heart of who we are.

As the phrase suggests, what really matters to us as a religious people is not that we are each entitled to our beliefs (that is really a given), but the love which informs those beliefs. Beyond our individual beliefs is a common love that seeks to save lives from the pain of loss, the bewilderment of estrangement, the poverty of class and place, and the dulling mediocrity of finding meaning in a fractured world. What matters is not our freedom to believe but what we do with what we believe.

Our love for the world is not some abstract and sentimental feeling. We practice it every week we gather in worship, with every meal we serve, with the justice we aspire to create. As we continue to engage the spiritual theme of prayer in our worship this month, keep this little phrase before you. As none other than Billy Graham once wrote: "The most eloquent prayer is through hands that heal and hearts that bless." So may our love bless the world.
